in four of these positions and will gladly relinquish some of them. These positions are sometimes viewed as nonessential and they do not get the due diligence they deserve. It has been my experience in observing other VFW Posts around the state that when you have members serving in these positions that are active they can make a good post into a great post. Many of you may think the duties of these appointed positions are too difficult or think you may not have enough time. None of the requirements of these positions are difficult or are too time consuming. Most importantly we have experienced mentors available in this post to help. You won't be alone. Check on these positions, ask questions and I would also recommend considering volunteering for a positions that matches your individual skill set or interest. Please consider volunteering for one of these appointments before our May meeting.

We will also need to re-appoint members to our House Committee. As many of you already know our house committee oversees the maintenance and operation of our post home and the operations of our canteen. This committee has served us well and is one of the main reasons for the success of our canteen operations. I plan on reappointing all present members of the house committee to another term if they desire. We could use a few more members and would welcome any new volunteers with fresh ideas so please consider volunteering.

In the past year we have launched an Activities Committee that has been tasked to identify, plan and execute various functions that this post can execute to raise funds and/or increase our visibility in the community. We are supporting a fund raiser with the Underdog Animal Rescue Shelter with Harley Davison Madison. This is a very active committee that has come up with some great initiatives on their own and have identified ongoing activities that this post should support. But we need more members so please consider helping us out. The meetings for both the House and Activities Committees are held on the fourth Tuesday of the month here at Post. These meetings are informal but no less important.

We will be hosting the Department of Wisconsin District 2 Meeting on May 4, 2019 here at Post 1318. This is a great opportunity for any and all post members to attend and see what the VFW does for veterans when we combine efforts with other posts in south central Wisconsin that make up District 2. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

I was absent from our March meeting as I was attending the VFW National Legislative Conference in Washington D. C. from March 3-7. I do this in my capacity as a member of Wisconsin VFW Legislative Committee. Also attending this conference was our State Commander (and Post Quartermaster) Gundel Metz. This was the first time that I attended this conference and it was really an eye opener. This conference reiterated to me the importance of our organization and it was one of the most important events I have ever participated in my life. The conference shows you the initiatives and efforts that our VFW National Legislative Office coordinates with Congress. More importantly you see the effects and the voice of over 1500 VFW Members from all over the nation first hand as they descend on Capitol Hill advocating for veterans issues. I was part of the delegation of twelve (12) Wisconsin members that traveled to this conference as part of an overall National VFW effort to engage members of Congress on veteran's issues.

At the start of the conference we attended seminars given by the VFW National Legislative Office on the main VFW issues that we should bring up with members of congress. We were instructed on how to address these issues with our congressman. We had five priority goals that we were stressing

- 1. <u>Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019</u> calling on Congress to pass H.R. 299
- 2. <u>Veterans Health Care</u> oversight of the VA Mission Act of 2018, improving health care for women Veterans, addressing the suicide rates.
- 3. Burn Pits calling on Congress to pass H.R. 663 or S. 191, Burn Pits Accountability Act
- 4. <u>Concurrent Receipt</u> calling on Congress to pass H.R. 303 or S. 208, Retired Pay Restoration Act, and H.R. 553, Military Surviving Spouses Equity Act.
- 5. <u>Transition Assistance Program</u> ensuring a seamless transition from Military to civilian life.

We presented and briefed these VFW Priority Goals to the offices of all eight (8) Wisconsin U.S. Representatives and both Wisconsin U.S. Senators. We were able to speak to the Wisconsin U.S. Representative from our district (2nd Congressional District of Wisconsin) Mark Pocan, and U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin. We also had the opportunity to sit in on the VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence's address to the combined House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees. Commander Lawrence's address to these committees was attended by over 1500 VFW and VFW Auxiliary members.

While in attendance at this conference the House of Representatives passed H.R. Bill 303 that increased initiatives to research the effect of Burn Pit exposure on our servicemen exposed in both Iraq and Afghanistan. The details on these VFW Priority Goals have been published in the VFW Magazine and are available on the VFW website.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP COSTS

Ever wonder what the cost of VFW Life Membership is? If you answered yes, then it means you must be thinking of becoming a life member. There are two ways you can do life membership. One is to pay the amount outright. The second way is to do a 12 month installment plan. If you want to become a life member and are not sure on how to do it, please contact the Post Quartermaster (Gundy). An annual member pays \$40 a year. Take that times 10 and in 10 years you pay \$400. Here are the costs for Life Membership:
