Greetings members!

Post 1318 was recognized as an All-State post for the first time in over ten (10) years at the Wisconsin VFW State Convention in Appleton on June 14, 2019. I want to thank everyone for all the hard work you have all done in the past year that enabled our post to achieve this distinction. We were one of twenty posts in Wisconsin that achieved that distinction this year. The Wisconsin VFW currently has over 260 posts so this is quite an honor. As many of you know our membership percentage was over 100% this year which is also the highest it has been in recent years. Achieving membership of over 100% is probably the most important and difficult criteria to obtain when a post is competing for All-State recognition. However it is not the only requirement.

Posts designated as All-State must maintain accurate up-to-date records to include our election report, quarterly audits, and tax statements. Posts must show they are active in the community by submitting reports that show all the volunteer hours many of you have given to community projects such as hospital volunteer hours, veterans' court hours, animal rescue and legislative efforts. We are also evaluated by our participation in higher level VFW events such as attendance at the District 2 Meetings, Patriotic Rally, Flag Day, State Mid-Winter Conference, State Convention and National Convention. We also demonstrated that we can help lead initiatives through our concession stand at the Badger Football Game, the Ruck 22 March, Shop with a Cop and the Hogs and Dogs events. We maintained and even increased our membership this year and we have demonstrated that we are an active, viable and relevant post. That was due to all of your efforts. Thank You So Much and let's please maintain the momentum. In the coming year ask another veteran to join the VFW, volunteer for another event and come up with any idea you may have to make us a more active viable post. All of this we help us become the type of post we want for ourselves and our fellow veterans.

On June 1st we held our first Roger Boeker Memorial Dinner here at Post 1318. As many of you know Roger Boeker was a long-time post member that passed

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The new state budget has provisions that are very favorable for Wisconsin Veterans. The new budget includes an allocation of \$13,800,000 in state dollars to the Veterans Trust Fund. The Veterans Trust Fund is the main funding source to operate the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs (WDVA). The WDVA administers the Wisconsin specific veterans programs in the state. This recent allocation is the largest allocation of state dollars to the Veterans Trust Fund in history.

The Veterans Trust Fund had been sourced by revenue for from repayment of loans the WDVA made under its personal loan program, federal grants, and receipts from the Wisconsin Veterans Museum and from receipts of program revenue from the state veterans homes at King and Union Grove. These sources of revenue have been declining over the past years. Also there has been controversy in recent years on using the program revenue from the state veterans' homes at King and Union Grove and redirecting these funds from the veteran's homes to the Veterans Trust Fund. This is why the new budget uses general purpose funds to bolster the Veterans Trust Fund.

The new state budget also allocates \$18,000,000 dollars to build and maintain state veterans facilities at King and Union Grove and at the Northern Wisconsin Veterans Cemetery at Spooner, WI.

BLUE WATER NAVY ACT NOW LAW

VFW National Press Release

The national commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is saluting the president for signing the *Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019* into law last night.

"Tens of thousands of Blue Water Navy veterans of the Vietnam War and dependent children born with spina bifida due to a parent's toxic exposure will now benefit from this new law," exclaimed VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence, "and the VFW is proud to have helped lead the charge to return these benefits to these deserving veterans and to expand existing benefits to dependent children. We look forward to the Department of Veterans Affairs publishing implementation guidance on their website very soon."

The VFW-championed *Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019*, or H.R. 299, restores VA benefits to thousands of Blue Water Navy Vietnam veterans who had their disability eligibility taken away in 2002 after arbitrary regulatory changes. It benefits veterans exposed to Agent Orange while serving along the Korean DMZ with an earlier start date to encompass the timeframe when various defoliants were tested — to Sept. 1, 1967, instead of April 1, 1968 — and expands benefits to children born with spina bifida due to a parent's exposure in Thailand, coverage that already exists for the children of Vietnam and Korean DMZ veterans. The new law also requires the VA to report on research being conducted on a broad range of conditions possibly related to service in Southwest Asia, which is important for future legislative efforts to create a list of presumptive conditions for veterans seeking VA health care and benefits.

"The VFW is proud of the 116th Congress for ending this benefits inequity, and we salute President Trump for quickly signing H.R. 299 into law," said Lawrence.
