Greetings Comrades,

I hope everyone is doing well. As is usual, the year is going by fast. The Post has started getting involved with community and some organizations. As with most things, it starts out slow and builds over time.

As a member of the Wisconsin VFW, all members have a \$2,500 Accidental Death policy. This is at no cost to the member and is provided by AIL. In the coming months, you will be receiving a postcard in the mail from AIL informing you of this and asking you to identify beneficiary information. If you do not return the postcard or respond, you will still be covered. I would encourage you though to identify who your beneficiaries are. The Department has also partnered with SMB. This company provides free wills and burial kits to VFW members. You will receive a text message and an email from them asking you to set up an appointment to discuss your options. Again, this is a benefit that is being presented to you. It is up to you if you want to take advantage of it or not. If you have any questions or concerns about these benefits, please contact me or call State Headquarters.

Hopefully most of you are aware of the current membership incentives available to Post members. The quota for the \$50 rebate for those annual members who convert to life from Department Headquarters has been filled. My rebate offer is still available. With the Department quota being filled, I am increasing the rebate to \$100 to any annual member that converts to life by December 31, 2023. For

The 115th Fighter Wing had a very busy September this year and am happy to say that members from VFW 1318 were there to help us celebrate each event. September 7^{th,} we had our final welcoming of the F-35 mission to Truax Field, and were honored with guest speakers like Lieutant General Marc Sasseville, Vice Chief of the National Guard, Governor Tony Evers, Major General Paul Knapp Adjutant General for WI, and Fighter Wing Commander Colonel Bart Van Roo. The Fighter Wing currently has eight of our twenty aircraft, with the remainder coming to base next year. VFW NATIONAL UPDATE

- In February, the VFW filed an Amicus Curiae brief to the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals in support of claimants seeking relief from 3M for defective ear protection. 3M had tried to shift the blame to its subsidiary Aearo Technologies, who it said was responsible for the defective earplugs and who had filed Chapter 11 bankruptcy, to avoid paying claimants. In August, 3M settled for \$6.01 billion, consisting of \$5 billion in cash and \$1 billion in 3M stock. Payments will be made between 2023 and 2029. The bankruptcy appeal is being held in abeyance pending finalization of the settlement. It is estimated that approximately 240,000 military service members or veterans will be eligible to receive part of the settlement.
- The Justice Department and the Department of the Navy have announced an "Elective Option" for those filing claims under the Camp Lejeune Justice Act (CLJA) of 2022. The Elective Option is a potential settlement process based on diagnosis, time spent exposed to Camp Lejeune contaminated water, and if the claim involved death. There are important limitations to be mindful of for anyone interested in pursuing the Elective Option, including the latency period and limits on compensation for more than on e diagnosis. Additionally, the severity of any illness is not a factor in reaching a settlement under the Elective Option. Settlements range from \$100,000 to \$450,000, based on duration of exposure and type of illness. An additional amount of \$100,000 will be offered if the exposure resulted in death. There will not be an offset for VA disability benefits or VA medical care, but the offset may apply to other federal benefits. For more information, see https://www.justice.gov/opa/pr/justice-department-and-department-navy-announcevoluntary-elective-option-more-efficient. While the Elective Option may provide immediate relief for some, those seeking relief under the CLJA should consider all their options before making a decision. Consult with competent legal counsel to determine what is the best course of action for you.




